This course will mainly introduce the basic concepts and therapeutic intervention techniques in art therapy with a focus on practical creative exercises, case studies and discussion sessions. It is an assembly of theory and practice that will enhance students' understanding of this field in a practical and comprehensive way.	This course does not have a textbook. The necessary articles and documents will be distributed in class throughout the semester.

Course Structure / Schedule: (3+0+0) 3 / 5 ECTS

Extended Description:

The main goal of this course will be to understand that art can be an effective form of communication and intervention for a wide range of clinical problems and diagnoses. Lectures, readings and case studies will be used in this class with a focus on practical exercises and discussion sessions.

The door of the class will be closed 10 minutes after the class has started. If the door is closed, it means that the class has started. In this case, STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED NOT TO ENTER and WAIT until the first break.

Attendance is required and it will be taken within the first 10 minutes of each slot. Students who miss the first slot will be marked absent for the whole hour.

Students must have a legitimate reason for leaving early (before the class ends) and they should inform the instructor in advance.

Civil behavior involves being considerate and polite as required by social norms, towards all classmates and the instructor. Ethical behavior involves honorable conduct and refraining from all forms of cheating and plagiarism.

Students are expected to turn their cell phones off in the classroom. Using cell phones during class will be cause for dismissal from the classroom, and the student will be marked absent for the whole hour.
