The class starts by evaluating chronologically proceeds with architecture, sculpture and painting of different Islamic societies.Seminar on written and visual sources of Turkish and Ottoman art and architecture; analysis of sources, methodological issues related to their use; the relevance, reliability and limitations of particular types of documents; review of surveys and critical studies of primary sources; discussion of conventional and current approaches towards the use of primary sources for historical analysis.</p>
